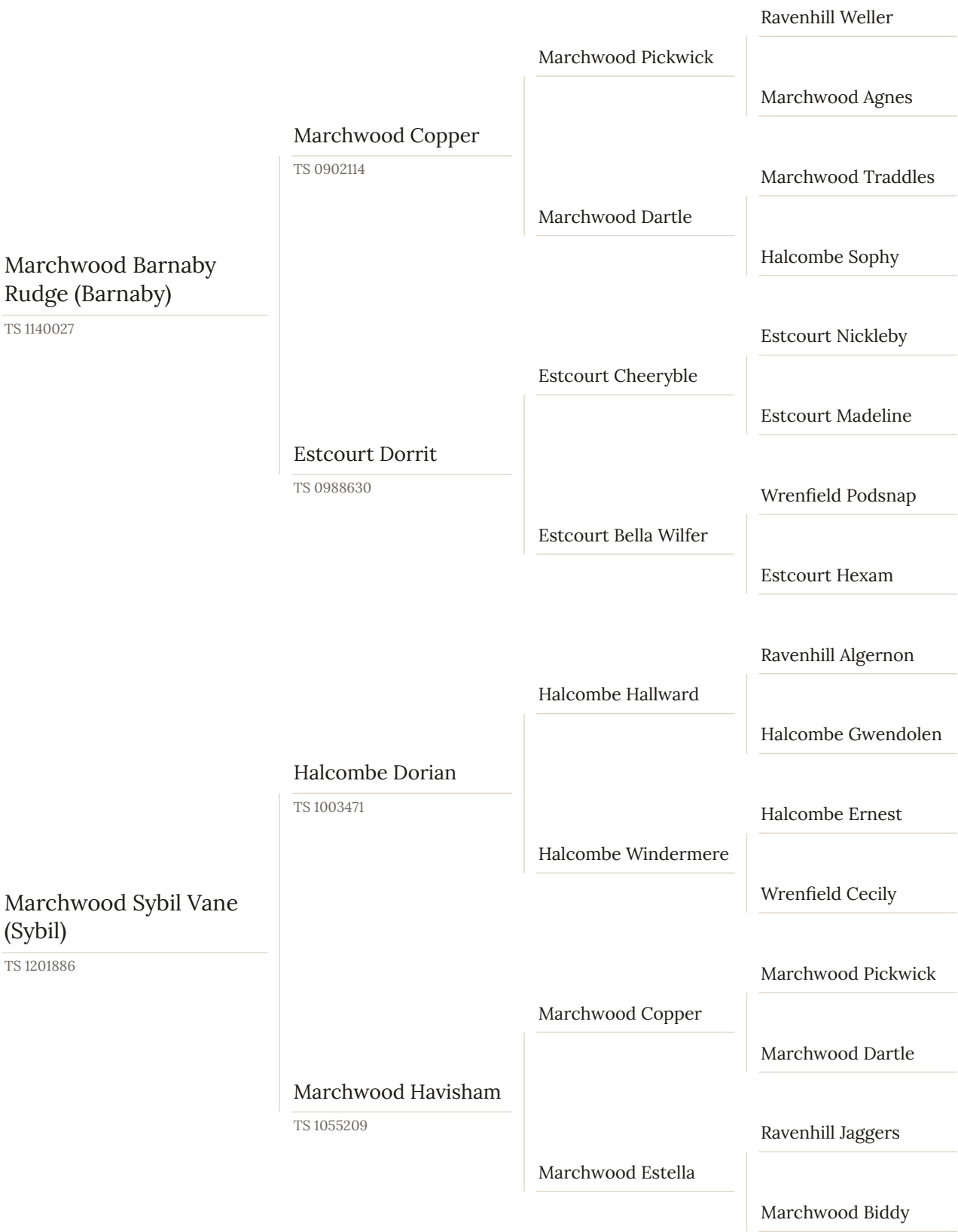

Pedigree as recorded by the breeder



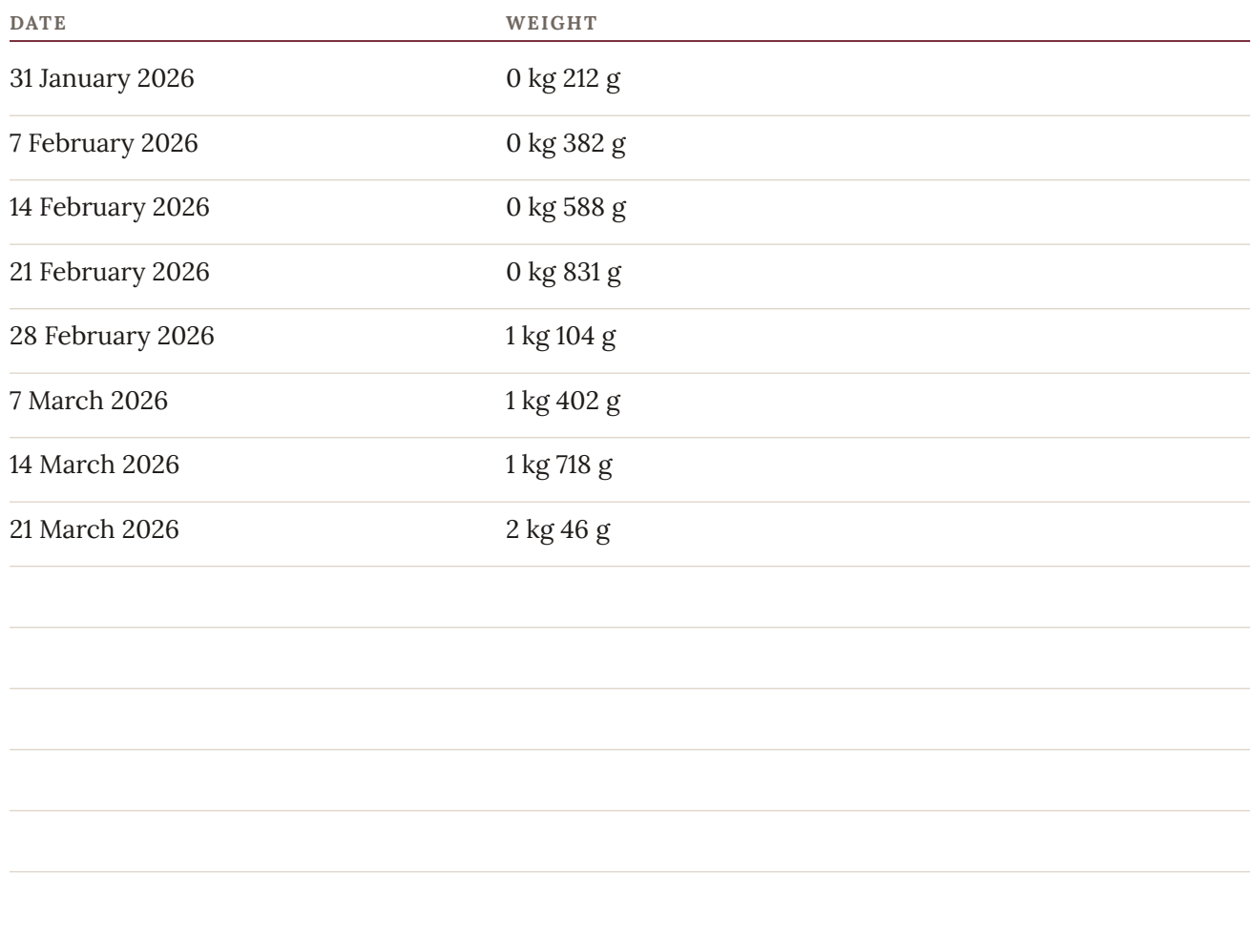

Feeding

FOOD	AMOUNT	MEALS A DAY	NOTES
Royal Canin Mini Starter	55 g	4	Soaked to a soft mash. Fussy eaters at this age are usually being offered too much.
Scrambled egg, no salt or butter	1 tsp	1	Two mornings a week, no more.

Small dogs and small stomachs: four meals a day until sixteen weeks, and do not be alarmed if she leaves a little. Weigh her weekly on the kitchen scales for the first month and write it down. A drop is worth a phone call.

This breed will become overweight on very little, and an overweight one with a heart to look after is a shorter life. Keep the waist.

A fortnight of her food is in the bag. Change it slowly, over seven days, if you change it at all.

From the breeder

Dear friends,

Sybil whelped four on the last day of January, in the room at the end of the passage where every Marchwood litter has been born for twenty-six years. Clementine was the second, at a quarter past four in the morning, and she was cross about it.

I want to say something plainly about health, because in this breed it is the only thing that matters. Both her parents were heart-tested by a cardiologist within the last twelve months, and both are MRI-graded for syringomyelia. The results are printed a few pages back, exactly as they were given to me. No breeder can promise you a healthy dog. What I can promise is that nothing was skipped, and that I have shown you the paper.

She has been on a grooming table twice a week since she was four weeks old. Keep that up — ten minutes on a Sunday will save you a matted, miserable dog in a year. Her ears need doing behind and underneath, and her feet want trimming level with the pad.

She is insured for four weeks from today, the documents are in the folder, and I would keep her covered for life.

One last thing, the important one. If ever you cannot keep her — illness, money, a move, a change of heart, and I have heard all of them without judgement — she comes back to me. Not to a rescue, not to a friend of a friend. To me, at whatever age, for as long as I am alive to open the door. It is written into the agreement you signed and I would honour it without the paper.

Ring whenever you like. Most of my old families still do.
